Preparing the Bottles Always be sure to clean the bottles well before you re-use. Tie the tan thread to the sticks to keep them from moving. Paint the bottom of the bottle blue to resemble water, if you want. The stern is the front side of the boat, which usually is closest to the largest sails and points upward.
